Speech Therapy

What is a Speech Pathologist?

Speech Pathologists assess and help people with communication disorders.

This includes difficulties with speaking, listening, understanding language, reading, writing, social skills, stuttering and using voice.

They also help people who experience difficulties with eating and drinking.

How can Autism Advisory and Support Service (AASS) assist you?

Our Speech Pathologists work closely with you to provide therapy sessions that are tailored to help individuals with autism. Intervention can be provided at our centre in Liverpool or in the community (eg. home, childcare, school, respite, day program and work placement).

Our Speech Pathologists can support you or your family member with:

- Improving and supporting different types of communication (Verbal and nonverbal)
- Play skills
- Social skills
- Training communication partners (e.g. parents and teachers)
- Support transitions to school or work

Our Speech Pathologists are eligible to provide services under Medicare, FaHCSIA: Helping Children with Autism funding, HICAPS and the NDIS.
