Established to support people with intellectual or developmental disability access appropriate mental health care, the Hubs offer face-to-face and virtual care, specialised assessment, care planning, reporting and recommendations, and capacity building. There are two hubs, one for adults and one for children and adolescents.

SIDMHOS has the objective of improving access for all adults with an intellectual disability to quality mental health care across NSW. Among the key tasks of SIDMHOS is providing clinical support to the state's Local Health Districts (LHDs), and creating opportunities for workforce development and capacity building, in order for consumers to receive specialist-level mental health care within their local community.

The Hub offers advice and help with local pathways; case-based discussions, team case reviews and joint team assessments.

Telephone advice and case-based discussions are offered to all registered health professionals practising in NSW. Referrals for SIDMHOS to participate in case reviews or conduct Joint team assessments are offered to psychiatrists and LHD mental health services who agree to provide continuing care.

The SCHN MHID Hub aims to improve the mental health of children and adolescents under 18 years of age with intellectual or developmental disability.

The Hub is run by the Developmental Psychiatry Team within the Department of Psychological Medicine at the Children's Hospital Westmead. The team includes a clinical psychiatrist, clinical psychologist, occupational therapist, social worker and service co-ordinator and manger.

The Hub is a short-term consultation service, becoming involved when assessment or treatment has not been successful and specialist expertise is required. The ongoing care remains with the referring clinician.

Services include joint consultation with the mental health clinician or medical professionals and the child or young person, and their family member or carer to provide assessment, diagnosis and treatment intervention of one to three consultations; clinical consultation to provide short-term treatment advice to the referrer and case-based discussions between the Hub psychiatrist and the referring clinician.

Referrals are accepted across NSW from paediatricians (after initial referral to CAMHS services), child psychiatrists, and CAMHS clinicians seeking advice.

Northern Sydney Intellectual Disability Health Service, located in Cremorne, is a multidisciplinary health service for school aged children, adolescents and adults with intellectual disability and complex health needs. This service provides medical and health consultations, advice and referrals. It works in conjunction with the patient's GP and/or paediatrician, other health services and disability service providers to deliver co-ordinated health care. People with intellectual disability who live in the Northern Sydney Local Health District are eligible to be seen at the clinic. The service also provides some outreach services to regional areas.

CANDID is a tertiary outpatient service which aims to support specialists working with people with intellectual disability by providing second opinions on complex cases. It is also an important training resource for medical students, psychiatry trainees and IDMH Fellows. It is located in the EUROA Centre at the Prince of Wales Hospital, Randwick. Referrals are accepted from specialists currently managing patients 18 years and older who will be offering continuing care (those aged 16–17 years will be considered after discussion).
